

CAUTION AGAINST MALPRACTICE IN OR AROUND THE EXAMINATION ROOM

Breach of instructions/regulations, irregularity, misconduct or dishonesty (cheating) in connection with **HODEB** examinations may lead to disqualification or cancellation of results of a candidate or of all candidates at a center. Any candidate found involving himself/herself in malpractice in the examination may be refused to continue with his/her examination, disqualified, and if the candidate is violent, he/she may be arrested and handed over to the Police. Such a candidate may be barred from sitting any subsequent Mock examination papers.

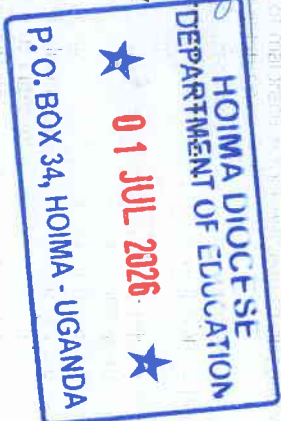
CANDIDATES AND ALL CONCERNED MUST NOTE THAT INVOLVEMENT IN MALPRACTICE IN ONE PAPER SHALL LEAD TO THE CANCELLATION OF RESULTS OF THE WHOLE MOCK EXAMINATION.

The following are cases of malpractice that will lead to disqualification, cancellation of results or arrest of a candidate(s).

1. Smuggling of unauthorized material into the examination room.
2. Copying from one another (collusion), or leaving work exposed such that another candidate can copy from.
3. External assistance given by teachers and/or any other persons.
4. Prior knowledge of examination questions, or confidential advance instructions.
5. Impersonation, i.e. hiring somebody else to sit the examination or where another person rather than the duly registered candidate sits the examination.
6. Improper behavior, e.g. indecent dressing, making noise, disobeying the Chief invigilator and the invigilators, violent behavior such as attacking or threatening invigilators, disrupting the examination, etc.
7. Substitution of examination scripts during or after the examination.
8. Irregularity, e.g. taking longer time than that stipulated on the question paper to **CAUSE** an examination or one candidate using different names.
9. **CAUSE** Tearing the answer booklet/script into loose sheets, tearing out any pages of the script or folding the script in anyway. Torn scripts will **not** be marked and candidates involved may have their results cancelled.
10. Being in possession of a **mobile phone** or any other communication gadgets.
11. Any other cases of malpractice that shall be detected.
12. Being in possession of books or revision notes while in confinement before Science practical.

HODEB reserves the right to declare publicly names of centres, candidates or anyone else who will have involved themselves in Mock Examination malpractice.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The purpose of this examination is to prepare candidates for the final examination. Candidates are advised to approach it without panic or fear.

The time allowed for each paper is shown against the name of the paper and **NO EXTRA TIME IS TO BE ALLOWED**. In case of any discrepancy, the time on the question paper must be taken as correct.

All morning and afternoon papers **MUST** begin at 9.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. respectively.

The Officer in charge of examinations at school must take all the necessary care and vigilance to guard against all forms of examination malpractices. Please stick to the time table to minimize leakages. Hoima Diocese Department of Education will send a team of Scouts to check on the compliance of schools to this effect.

The person appointed as a Chief invigilator together with invigilators **must** open the examination paper envelope inside the examination room before candidates at the beginning of the paper and sealed before them at the end of the paper.

Candidates are advised to follow the examination paper rubric, for example, they are not allowed to answer more questions than required. The extra questions will **not** be marked by examiners.

Candidates should write the **correct name** and **personal numbers**, as declared during registration, and should appear on all pages of your answer sheets.

Candidates should sit for only the examination papers registered. On the day of a practical examination, candidates with an afternoon paper should be favored to enter in the first shift.

(a) In 840/2 Computer Studies, the 2 hours 30 minutes **include the time for printing out the candidate's work.** No further printing should be done after the stipulated time.

DIRECTIONS TO CANDIDATES

- Ease yourself before entering the examination room. No candidate will be allowed to leave the examination room before the end of the examination time.
- Be at the examination hall at least 30 minutes before the start of the examination ready to be identified and checked. Any candidate who comes **more than 15 minutes late** from the start of an examination will **not** be allowed to sit the examination.
- Present yourself at the entrance to the examination hall for checking by the Chief invigilator/invigilators. They have been instructed to check you thoroughly, including your pockets, shoes and body.
- Do **not** indulge in any form of examination malpractice. Do **not** smuggle unauthorized materials e.g. notes, text books, etc. into the examination rooms; do **not** write on your body, clothes, mathematical sets, calculators or rulers.
- At the start of each examination, make sure you (or student representatives) examine the examination question paper envelope(s) to find out whether it/they is/are intact or already opened. If the envelope(s) is/are opened outside the examination room, then report immediately to the Secretary for Education **HODEB, P O Box 34 Hoima.**
- Follow the examination paper rubric and the instructions on the front page of the answer booklet. Do **not** use pencils to write answers. Answers written in pencil will **NOT BE MARKED**. Do **not** answer more questions than asked for in the rubric. The examiners will **not** mark the extra questions.
- Write your correct names, index numbers and signature on your answer booklets or sheets for all the papers you take. These must be the same as on the entry form you filled at registration for UNEB. Candidates with differing names in any of their papers will **not** get results.
- Sit only the examination papers you have registered for. No results will be issued for papers you have not registered for.
- Do **not** go out before or immediately at the end of each examination. Witness the checking and sealing of the scripts first.
- Leave used or unused answer booklet(s) inside the examination room.
- No separate paper will be provided for rough work.
- Mobile phones are not allowed in or around the examination room.**
- Sharing of calculators, mathematical tables, rulers, pens, etc. is **not** permitted during the examination.
